Hearth Connection manages a network of supportive housing providers that includes mobile supportive service providers that use predominantly private market scattered-site housing and site-based supportive housing communities. There are over 1,000 people in programs today, including over 300 single adults, 200 families with children and 35 unaccompanied youth. Hearth Connection does not deliver services or housing directly, it is an intermediary, administrative entity.



Qualifications:

To be eligible, the individual must be long term homeless.

Other Information:

The program works in three regions of the state including: Northeastern Minnesota (Aitkin, Carlton, Cook, Itasca, Koochiching, Lake and St. Louis and Minnesota Chippewa Tribe Bois Forte, Fond du Lac and Grand Portage); Metro Regional (Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey, Scott and Washington); and Southern Minnesota (20 Counties in South Central and Southeastern Minnesota).


Tasks Unlimited provides supported employment, housing and recovery services for people with mental illness so that they achieve a full life with the rights and responsibilities of adults in our society.

Programs and Services include:

- Supported Employment Program offers mental health services, paid on-the-job training and basic living skills development. Participants can take part in the supported employment program with or without supported housing. All participants must qualify for and complete one of Tasks Unlimited paid training programs upon admission. Successful training graduates average nearly 11 years of steady employment with the organization.
- Housing lodges are stable, supportive homes in clean, desirable neighborhoods throughout the Twin Cities for people with mental illness. Tasks Unlimited lodges do not have 24-hour supervision. Members manage their own lives and provide support to each other in daily activities. Lodge members decide their own rules, pay rent, clean, shop for groceries, go to work and participate in community activities just as one would do in any living situation with roommates.
- Mental Health Services provides medication management, illness management and recovery groups, chemical health program, wellness program, and recreation program.

Qualifications:

- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Meet State of MN requirements for serious and persistent mental illness.
- Express a willingness to actively participate in the program.
- Be physically prepared to participate in activities.
- Not pose a risk of serious harm to self or others.
- Have support and funding from the State of Minnesota Vocational Rehabilitation Services.

- A veteran is defined as anyone who served 181 consecutive days active duty with an honorable discharge.
- Must have entered service in Minnesota or currently live in Minnesota.
- Spouses of eligible veterans must be over 55 years of age and reside in the state.

Other Information:

- To apply, visit www.minnesotaveteran.org and download an application.
- Skilled nursing care is available at every facility (except Hastings).
- Private and semi-private rooms, library, coffee shop, barber/beautician, and family lounges available.
- Resident Work Program and Domiciliary Program are rehabilitative with the goal of returning residents to a non-institutional setting (at Minneapolis and Hastings only).
- Staff are trained to anticipate mental, physical and social needs of the residents.

“We believe that everyone deserves a second chance, no matter what their criminal background.”

The Reconnect program is a program and drop-in center providing information, referrals, and specialized one-on-one planning tailored to the specific challenges that come with having a criminal background. The Reconnect program is a relationship-based service that supports, respects, and empowers the whole person.

Qualifications:

Anyone with a felony, gross misdemeanor, or misdemeanor on their record, whether just out of a federal, state, or county correctional facility or years after release.

Program Services include:

- Housing- Offers case-by-case information and referrals to housing opportunities that meet individual needs and are open to those with a criminal background.
- Employment- Resources are available for use to access multiple online databases to help searching for jobs in fields that are often open to people with felonies. Daily job openings are posted along with one-on-one recommendations and assistance with finding employment.
- Transportation– Subsidized bus passes are offered at a reduced price.
- Clothing– Referrals to clothing resources are provided, as well as hygiene products.
- Voicemail– Free voicemail number is available for those without a phone, only available for up to six months.
- Computers and Phones– Available to use for job searching, house searching, setting up appointments, checking in with probation officers, etc. Setting up an e-mail account, faxing, copying, and printing documents are available upon request.

Minnesota Place Apartments provide a safe and supportive environment for chronically homeless tenants to stabilize their housing and income, build relationships with others, and access appropriate services.

Eligible residents must meet the Department of Housing and Urban Development's "chronic homeless" definition (An unaccompanied individual with a disabling condition who has been continuously homeless for a year or more or has had at least four episodes of homelessness in the past three years).

The mission of Portland Village is to provide families safe, sober, affordable housing in combination with support services that will facilitate family stabilization, an increase in skills and income, an increase in health and wellness, and overall housing stabilization. Portland Village is a 26-unit, sober, supportive, permanent, multi-family housing community in Minneapolis. Portland Village consists of three apartment buildings and a central administrative building that houses a PICA/HeadStart daycare program, staff offices, and a large family activity room. The apartment buildings contain 8-two bedroom units, 12-three bedroom units, and 4-four bedroom units. Each building includes access to laundry facilities, storage area, and community room. A six computer resource lab is available for adults.

- All units have kitchens, full baths, air conditioning, bed, chair and table

- Rent is subsidized. Residents pay 30 % of their income for rent
- Supportive services are offered to all residents. Case managers are available to help residents maintain sobriety, find employment, continue their schooling and access other resources.

Emanuel Apartments is a 101 unit sober, supportive, permanent, singles housing program that is situated on the Hiawatha Light Rail Line, bus lines, and is near several community human service agencies, hospitals, schools, and other community resources. Emanuel consists of 95 studio apartments and 6-one bedroom apartments that include a tenant lounge area, a computer lab, an exercise room, an enclosed courtyard, walking trail, and staff offices. Emanuel Apartments include access to laundry facilities and a community room, a ten computer resource lab and meeting room is available for adults.

Qualifications:

Emanuel housing serves economically disadvantaged single men and women. Emanuel housing includes specialized housing that serves 11 homeless veterans through the VASH program, 54 units of housing that prefers GRH eligible homeless disabled adults, 14 units of housing that serve chronically homeless disabled adults through the shelter and care program, 11 flat rate units, and six project based section eight subsidized units.





Cochran Recovery Program is a dual-diagnosis treatment program with 42 beds for males and females, 18 years and older. Clients are assessed as to their level of care; high, medium, and low acuity. We offer issue-specific groups, workshops, financial planning, transportation, and adult education seminars. Our goal is for the client to become secure in their recovery and to be self-sufficient.

Trauma Informed Therapy was added in 2013 as a treatment modality. The plan is developed in collaboration with the client and addresses trauma; its impact on the individual, the prevention of re-traumatization, the provision of, or referral to, trauma-informed, and trauma-specific treatment and supports; and the integration of trauma, mental health, and substance abuse in counseling and treatment programs.

Cochran Intensive Out-Patient Services provides counseling and educational programming up to 18 clients, provides interactive educational opportunities, individual counseling and group therapy. Our clients undergo chemical health assessments, and offer in-house meetings that subscribe to the 12-step program for recovery. Each client is also provided referral services for continuing care for their psychiatric and mental health needs.

Cochran Group Residential Housing provides a safe, sober place for up to 32 men who are sometimes homeless to reside until they are able to use the tools provided to enable them to again live independently. We are exploring innovative approaches to help end homelessness in our community by expanding services and introducing evaluation methods to help us understand what works to provide positive outcomes for our homeless. Other services provided are medical management, counseling in daily living skills, transportation to professional off-campus appointments, and once a week transportation to shop for essential personal items.

Detoxification Center includes 27 beds and is located on the campus and serves surrounding Counties for their detoxification needs. Most clients are referred by law enforcement and provide transportation when needed.





Anishinabe Wakiagun is not a shelter, but provides permanent housing that encourages long-term residency to maximize stability in the individual's life. Each resident has his or her own room, but shares dining and bathroom facilities with other residents. Case management, health services, and other support services are available. The average length of a resident's stay is 21 months, with the longest at 4 1/2 years.

Qualifications:

Residents must have a Detox History of at least three times in the past year; one or more attempts at chemical dependency treatment in the past and have four episodes of homelessness in the past three years. Other indicators of eligibility include physical deterioration and evidence that the individual is incapable of self-management due to alcohol use.

Other Information:

Most chronic alcoholics do not have health care coverage. The goal of the health care management component is to reduce the number of times emergency services are used by the resident and introduce them to health care systems. As residents of Anishinabe Wakiagun, the individual is entitled to medical coverage and their continuing eligibility is monitored by their case manager.

Healing Phase (typically 8-12 weeks) - Identify and address key areas of life that need spiritual and/or emotional healing. Regular meetings with a biblical counselor and referral resources are recommended as residents continue classes, chapels, work study, and other activities.

Equipping Phase (may vary from 4-8 weeks) - Equip residents with tools to succeed in life. These areas are addressed as needed: literacy training, GED training, life skill classes and work readiness training. Resident continues with chapels, work therapy and other activities and meets regularly with a case coordinator.

Finishing Phase (length varies) - Upon completion of the equipping phase men must obtain full time employment and/or sober housing in order to graduate. This phase is designed to help men restore their enthusiasm for recovery and spirituality, and keep the momentum of change moving forward. Part time work is allowed in this phase.

Transition Phase (typically 3-4 months) - Helps men to grow stronger through accountability in finances, work readiness, and recovery.

After care program (Christian Recovery Support Group for the male residents) - Meets every Thursday from 6:00 to 8:30pm at New Hope Center.

Permanent Supportive Housing connects families to their home and their community. Once a family moves into PSH, a social worker helps each family set and monitor progress of goals, improve decision-making skills, make community connections, and provide crisis intervention. Through this model, families have access to other professionals that include a case manager, mental health support counselor, parent educator, and life skills worker.



Clients have an opportunity to discover some of the barriers in their life that may contribute to their inability to proceed with recovery. A team of professionals, including licensed counselors, physicians, nurses, psychologists, a chaplain, and a physical fitness trainer make up the treatment team. Individualized aftercare planning allows specific client goals to be addressed based on their vocational, social, educational, emotional, and spiritual needs.

Extended Primary Care:

For the chronic chemically dependent person, Project Turnabout's Extended Care program provides the additional time needed to stabilize and strengthen recovery. The decision to proceed into the Extended Care program is based on the physical condition of the patient and other assessments. In Extended Care, staff assist the patient with developing an individualized treatment and aftercare plan with emphasis placed on maintaining a therapeutic atmosphere.

This 20-bed unit offers a warm, feminine environment that projects respect and dignity for the individual and celebrates women's empowerment and recovery in its art, décor, and culture. The Women's Residential Program offers both primary and extended care stay options ranging from approximately 30 days to 120 days.

Qualifications:

The Women's Program accepts females 18 years of age and older. When entering the center for women's recovery, each patient receives a thorough assessment, which addresses the following: physical and psychological needs, chemical use history, social, spiritual, dietary, emotional, education, employment screening, and family history.

Other Information:

The women's unit on campus offers women clients a comfortable living area, including a lounge and laundry facilities, coffee room and group room. While keeping the focus on chemical dependency, other areas of the women's lives are explored to help identify issues that create barriers to the recovery process.

Women can receive short term residential, long term residential and/or transitional living options based on their needs. Individualized aftercare planning allows specific client goals to be addressed based on their vocational, social, educational, emotional, and spiritual need. Aftercare planning is vital to the recovery process and may include referrals to a halfway house or other post primary treatment living facility, which promotes an abstinent lifestyle.
