

The *Access Center* provides mental health assessments for first-time, non-emergency patients. Walk in from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday – Friday for an assessment at the Colonial Campus.

The **Baker Act Receiving Facility** offers 24-hour emergency, involuntary assessments for children and teens with psychiatric symptoms at the Colonial Campus.

The *Community Action Team (CAT)* offers a community behavioral health and co-occurring treatment solution for parents and caregivers of seriously emotionally disturbed children as an alternative to residential treatment or psychiatric hospitalization.

The *Crisis Stabilization Unit* provides secure, inpatient psychiatric stabilization for youth who require the highest level of care and are at risk of harming themselves or others.

Day Treatment offers structured programming and treatment in the daytime to youth ages 13 to 17 years old that are in need of more intensive services than outpatient services.

The *Juvenile Addiction Receiving Facility (JARF)* offers voluntary and involuntary substance abuse services (per the Marchman Act) to children and teens at the Colonial Campus.

Outpatient Psychiatry Services include psychiatric evaluations and medication management services.

Outpatient Therapy Services offers voluntary therapy and counseling, in both individual and group settings, for youth ages 3-17 with a mental health or substance abuse diagnosis.

Residential Substance Abuse Treatment is provided at the Vince Smith Campus for youth ages 13 to 17 with a substance dependence diagnosis. The program provides a 24-hour supervised, structured setting with intensive treatment programming, family counseling, and an academic program provided through the School District of Lee County.

The **Substance Abuse Diversion Program** is an outpatient treatment program that serves as an alternative to court for youth who are arrested for a substance abuse related crime.
